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1. PREAMBLE: Students during first year of their degree course is acquainted with Indian Constitution and Indian Government. Along with this they are provided courses like Rural Local Self Government and Urban Local Self Government under SEC. Those who have successfully completed his first year is eligible for certificate course. This syllabus is prepared for second year of degree course. After successful completion of second year students will be awarded Diploma.

In this year we are going to study – Government of Maharashtra, Politics of Maharashtra, Selected Indian Political Thinkers, Some Concepts of Political Science etc. Contents of the syllabus in these papers is going to provide theoretical and practical knowledge of political system in general and political system of Maharashtra in particular. Students will be familiar with different schools of thoughts. Moreover, some practical based activities are going to be undertaken to support the theory of Political Science. Thus after successful completion of second year student will be eligible to award diploma.

2. PROGRAMME LEARNING OUTCOMES (POs)

- Students will be familiar with political system in Maharashtra
- Students will be able to compare political thoughts of different Indian thinkers.
- Students will be familiar with basic concepts of political science
- Students will be familiar with Party Politics in Maharashtra
- Students will be able to understand political science with Indian Knowledge Perspective.

3. **DURATION**:

BA in Political Science programme shall be a FULL TIME COURSE of 3/4 years that is 6/8 Semesters duration with 22 credits per semester. (Total Credits = 132/176)

4. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

The candidate who has qualified BA I year or BA Certificate Course or Equivalent is eligible for admission for this course. The criteria for admission is as per the rules and regulations set from time to time by concerned departments, HEIs, university, government and other relevant statutory authorities.

5. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction shall be ENGLISH or MARATHI. The students will have an option to write answer-scripts in English or Marathi.

6. EXAMINATION PATTERN:

The pattern of examination will be Semester End Examination with Internal Assessment/ Evaluation.

NOTE: Separate passing is mandatory for both, Semester End Examination and Internal Evaluation/Assessment. (Annexur-I)

- MINOR: Course may be from different disciplines of same faculty of DSC Major
- OE (Open Elective): Elective courses/Open Elective to be chosen compulsorily from faculty other than that of the Major.
- VSC/ SEC: Vocational Skill Courses (MAJOR related)/ Skill Enhancement Courses
- **AEC/ VEC / IKS:** Ability Enhancement Courses (English, Modern Indian Language)/Value Education Courses (Sem. II Democracy, Elections & Indian Constitution, (DEC) Sem. IV Environmental Studies (EVS)/ Indian Knowledge System (Generic & Specific))
- OJT/FP/RP/CEP/CC: On-Job Training (Internship/Apprenticeship) / Field Project (Major related)/ Research Projects (Major related) Community Engagement (Major related)/ Co-Curricular courses(CC) such as Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sport, and Fitness, Cultural activities, NSS/NCC and Fine /applied/visual/performing Arts / Vivek Vahini etc.
